Located on the second floor of the Charles E. Whittaker Courthouse, the Bell Room Historical Gallery tells the story of the federal court in Western Missouri - the cases, the judges, the people whose lives were shaped by the decisions made here.

Features

The gallery includes:

- The court's landmark cases from the Greenlease kidnapping to the Hyatt disaster to the trials of Tom Pendergast and Nick Civella.
- A timeline tracing the types of cases heard by the court since its creation in 1822.
- Interactive audio-visual units where visitors can take quizzes and watch videos about the court.
- Information about what it's like to serve on a jury or how to file bankruptcy.

Did You Know?

During the Civil War, future federal judge John Philips led a Union cavalry regiment in the **Battle of Westport**.

Walt Disney filed for bankruptcy here before he moved to Hollywood to animate his famous mouse.

As a young attorney, future Supreme Court Justice **Thurgood Marshall** represented the Kansas City plaintiffs suing to integrate the **Swope Park swimming pool.**

Free agency in **Major League Baseball** exists today because of a case heard in this court.

Country superstars Minnie Pearl, Roy Acuff and Porter Wagoner all testified in a Western District case involving The Grand Ole Opry trademark.
